Know the Facts About Opioids

Opioid misuse in the United States is a big problem. The number of deaths from pain medicine overdoses has gone up over the past 20 years. One way to help reduce overdose deaths is by learning more about opioids.



The Facts About Opioids

- Prescription opioids are a type of pain medicine. They work the same as illegal drugs, such as heroin and opium. Opioids include hydrocodone (Vicodin), oxycodone (OxyContin), morphine and codeine.
- Risk of death is higher when opioids are taken with alcohol or other medications.
- Opioids block pain signals that travel from the nerves to the brain.
- Because opioids may cause changes to the brain, they can be addictive.
- Opioid misuse can develop quickly.
- Anyone can develop a problem with opioids.
- Opioid misuse can cause overdose and death.
